"When I graduated from ISEG in the late 1980s I had my first contact with the personal computer. Nowadays, any modern smartphone possesses more processing capacity and memory than the vintage PC 486 of the 1980s. Access to this technology revolutionised studies in those days. It became much easier to write a report or to create a spreadsheet, albeit with one condition - I had to go to the School's computer room. Now 30 years later we are living a new paradigm - for the student starting their university studies at the end of 2020 will experience a much different reality than that of their colleagues in previous years. Nowadays university is where the student is situated, that is to say, at home, at the study centre, or at the School. For as long as they have access to platforms that connect to the university, synchronously or asynchronously, students can follow lectures which are delivered simultaneously in-person and online and also have access

to the Library and the Academic Services. Accordingly, the challenge for universities is to provide environments for learning, collaboration, and interaction which are both interesting and challenging, as well as to develop skills for the efficient and effective use of these new technologies for students, teachers, and staff alike.



In September 2020, just as back in the 1980s, ISEG will be at the technological forefront and will be practicing the leading international practices with innovative solutions which enable coexistence between teachers, students, and the services in the form of a collaborative and hybrid learning system.
