If it is true that this problem has been accentuated with the Covid-19 pandemic, then it is also true that the World Health Organization (WHO) identified this silent problem last year and asked for action from world leaders. A missed opportunity.

It is therefore essential that there is a reflection on higher education regarding this matter, because here too we are an exception. The Bologna Process has aspects very positive, but the decrease in the duration of the cycles study led to an increase in the teaching load that is very detrimental to the quality of life and well-being of University students.


