#### Introduction

This working paper presents information gathered to prepare the text "Monetary arrangements with dependencies", to be published in the <u>Routledge Handbook of the History of Central Banking</u> (edited by Clemens Jobst and Stefano Ugolini).

The bulk of the information is presented in a table that attempts to summarize the political evolution and the monetary evolution of all European colonies and protectorates since the 15th century and all (European and other) colonies and protectorates that existed in the framework of the contemporary world society since the 19th century.

A summary of this information tries to identify the main regularities of the monetary evolution of colonial empires during the last half millennium.

These materials are preceded by a presentation of the main conclusions as general remarks.

#### General remarks

First colonial epoch (15th – early 19th century)

European expansion started in the 15th century with the occupation of Atlantic islands, most of them uninhabited, and with the establishment of trade factories in Africa.

Of course, previously uninhabited islands did not have a previous monetary system. This allowed the easy formal introduction of metropolitan monetary standards. However, the heterogeneous trade relations of most of these islands implied also the existence of heterogeneous circulating media.

Previously inhabited islands and Western African societies did not have previous sophisticated monetary systems. This brought a monetary situation that was, in a certain sense, similar to the one of the uninhabited Atlantic islands: formal introduction of metropolitan monetary standards was relatively

easy, but the heterogeneous trade relations of these previously inhabited islands and trade factories also implied the existence of heterogeneous circulating media.

Anyway, the main dependencies of the European colonial powers between the 16th and the early 19th centuries were located in America. American societies did not also have previous sophisticated monetary systems. This might have led to a monetary situation similar to the one already presented for the Atlantic islands and the trade factories in Africa: formal introduction of metropolitan monetary standards, heterogeneous circulating media. And this was the case for most Danish, Dutch, English, later British, French and Swedish dependencies, and even for Portuguese dependencies until the 17th century. However, the same was not true for Castilian, later Spanish, dependencies, and Portuguese dependencies from the 18th century on, because of the production of precious metals. The Castilian dependencies of Mexico and Peru became, from the 16th century on, the main world producers of silver; and the Portuguese dependencies (Brazil) became from the 18th century on the main world producers of gold. This had both local and global monetary consequences. Locally, the introduction of metropolitan monetary standards became effective without much difficulty; and globally, the Castilian silver coins and Castilian monetary standards influenced the monetary life of vast regions, especially in America and the Far East. In America, Castilian silver coins made up a significant part of the circulating media in most of the regions of the continent controlled by European powers, and the most widespread Castilian coin, the real of eight escudos, usually called piece of eight, became a generalized informal unit of account in most American colonial territories.

Besides the Atlantic islands, the trade factories in Africa and the American dependencies, European colonial empires of the first colonial epoch included trade factories in the Indian Ocean and the Far East. These regions were quite different from the other elements of the European colonial empires, because they had previous sophisticated monetary systems, mainly based on silver. It is possible to say that these monetary systems remained in force during the first colonial epoch, even because trade with Europe never became a dominant element of the economic life of the Indian Ocean and the Far East during this epoch.

Anyway, the situation was different in the Indian Ocean and the Far East, because of the different impact of the silver from the American colonies of Castile, which was very significant in the Far East, and much less important in the Indian Ocean. As a consequence, the Indian Ocean standards remained in force, while the Far East gradually became what may be called a piaster area, that is to say, a region where the monetary standard was the Castilian real of eight escudos, known in the Far East as the piaster.

#### Second colonial epoch (mid-19th – mid-20th century)

The late 18th and the early 19th centuries witnessed a reduction of European dependencies in America. Meanwhile, some Atlantic islands ceased to be true dependencies and became typical European societies. However, the 19th century also witnessed an expansion of European dependencies in Western and Southern Africa, the Indian Ocean, the Far East, the Pacific and the

Mediterranean, leading to what may be called the second colonial epoch. Meanwhile, former European dependencies (such as the United States of America) and non-European powers (such as Japan) also joined the imperialist club.

Besides the political independence of most British, French, Spanish and Portuguese colonies, which entailed monetary independence, although usually in continuity with the previous monetary regime, the main monetary change in the American continent was the dwindling of the production of precious metals in the former Spanish and Portuguese colonies. This led to the trend of consolidation of metropolitan monetary standards in the remaining colonies in America.

Western and Southern African societies did not have previous sophisticated monetary systems. This allowed the relatively easy introduction of metropolitan monetary standards, in spite of the existence of difficulties, usually linked with the resistance to the establishment of colonial rule itself.

European dependencies in the Indian Ocean had previous sophisticated monetary systems. This implied that, in spite of all attempts to introduce metropolitan monetary standards, the traditional silver based standards usually remained in force (and even penetrated inland in some East African territories). At the same time, the weight of the British controlled Empire of India in the economy of the region implied that the Indian rupee became the international monetary standard of the region, which was transformed into a rupee zone for all practical matters.

European (and American and Japanese) dependencies in the Far East had previous sophisticated monetary systems. This implied that, just as in the Indian Ocean, in spite of all attempts to introduce metropolitan monetary standards, the traditional silver based standards usually remained in force. In this region, it was the previous impact of the Mexican real of eight escudos that gave some unity to the monetary evolution: the Far East remained basically a piaster zone. Even Japan and China, when reforming their monetary systems in the late 19th century, adopted the piaster, under the name of yen in Japan in 1871 and under the name of yuan in China from the 1890s on, as the definition of their monetary unit. Another interesting case is the one of the Philippines, which kept the real or piaster standard during American occupation, which lasted from 1898 till 1946. The case of Japanese dependencies — Korea, Taiwan, and Manchukuo — might seem an exception, as the Japanese monetary standard was imposed on them (the Japanese standard was even extended to other occupied territories during the Second World War). However, as noticed, the Japanese monetary unit, the yen, had been previously defined as equal to the piaster.

The case of European (and American and Japanese) dependencies in the Pacific was similar to the one of Western and Southern Africa: absence of previous sophisticated monetary systems; relatively easy introduction of metropolitan monetary standards. An interesting example is the evolution of several archipelagos (Micronesia, Northern Marianas and Palau) that were for some time controlled by Spain, were sold to Germany in the wake of the defeat of Spain in the war with the United States in 1898, became Japanese mandates in the wake of World War I, and became American mandates in the wake of World War II. In these territories, Spanish, German, Japanese and American standards were successively used.

European dependencies in the Mediterranean had previous sophisticated monetary systems, usually of Ottoman origin. However, the metropolitan territories were very close, and there were very intense trade and financial relations with Europe. This led to the gradual replacement of previous Ottoman monetary standards by metropolitan (British, French and Italian) monetary standards.

#### Notes:

- Territories in the table are today's members and observers of the United Nations that were European colonies and protectorates since the 15th century or colonies and protectorates in the framework of the contemporary world society since the 19th century, and non-self-governing territories according to the official United Nations lists. Territories are designated in the table by their present names.
- Mention is made of dependencies that became part of former metropolitan societies (as Alaska, Azores, Canaries, Madeira and Hawaii), but not of countries that resulted from the break up of former confederations (as the Soviet Union and Yugoslavia).
- The Kingdom of Spain was the result of the merger of the Iberian kingdoms of the Western Hapsburg Empire, after the separation of the non-Iberian parts of that Empire, as a consequence of the so-called War of Spanish Succession (1701-1713). Until the early 18th century overseas dependencies were exclusively linked to the Kingdom of Castile.
- The United Kingdom of Great Britain was the result of the merger of the Kingdoms of England (including Wales) and Scotland in 1707. Until the early 18th century overseas dependencies were exclusively linked to the Kingdom of England.
- In the case of former British colonies, granting of Dominion status implies self-government in internal matters (a statute akin to a protectorate); granting of the Statute of Westminster implies self-government in international relations (a statute akin to full independence).
- The mention 'absence of monetary system' applies to uninhabited territories or huntinggathering societies, in which long- and even short-range exchanges are supposed to be non-existent or exceptional.
- The mention 'incipient monetary system' applies to agricultural societies, in which long- and even short-range exchanges are supposed to be a minor element of economic life.
- The mention of a metropolitan currency standard implies the formal use (sometimes *de jure* but not *de facto*) of the metropolitan monetary unit and means of payment.
- Monetary units are indicated by their official name and a reference to the political territory of their origin.
- Absence of mention of an issuing entity implies that the means of payment are directly issued by the government.

- The mention 'currency board' applies to an entity that issues fiduciary means of payment with integral reserve requirements and does not perform commercial or investment banking activities.
- The mention 'issuing bank' applies to an entity that issues fiduciary means of payment with fractional reserve requirements and also performs commercial or investment banking activities.
- The mention 'central bank' applies to an entity that issues fiduciary means of payment with fractional reserve requirements and does not perform commercial or investment banking activities.
  - As a rule, commercial banks issuing scriptural means of payment are not mentioned.
