Mannheim

Studying in Mannheim means studying in the heart of Germany, close to Heidelberg, Frankfurt, Munich, and Paris. Together with its neighboring cities Heidelberg and Ludwigshafen, Mannheim is part of the Rhine-Neckar metropolitan region. About 2.4 million inhabitants, a great infrastructure and several companies form one of the most attractive business hubs in Germany. Next to its industrial charm, Mannheim has many green areas along its two rivers. It also offers a great variety of shopping, nightlife, restaurants, museums, and cafés. Another local gem is the close-by Palatinate, a well-known wine growing region ideal for hiking trips.

Exchange students are welcome to come for the fall and/or the spring semester. Please note that the housing situation in Mannheim tends to be a lot more relaxed in the spring semester. Thus, if students have the option between fall and spring, we recommend students come during the spring semester.

Nomination and Application

Fall Semester

Nomination period: 15 March – 15 April 2026

Application deadline: 30 April 2026

Spring Semester

Nomination period: 15 September – 15 October 2026

Application deadline: 31 October 2026

Unfortunately, we cannot accept any late nominations. Nominations are entered directly into our online nomination portal. The link to the portal will be sent to all partners by our colleagues at the Central International Office before the beginning of the nomination period. After the nominations have been submitted by our partner institutions, we will contact the students with instructions on how to complete the online application.





Arrival and Services



Arrival

We request that students arrive at least one week before the start of lectures in order to enroll and attend the Welcome Week.

Orientation

Mandatory orientation sessions take place during the Welcome Week. There will be an orientation session held by the Central International Office (general orientation) and a welcome and information session held by the Business School.

Housing

We offer housing for students from overseas, but the responsibility for that lies at the Central International Office. Please contact Ms. Ricarda Diehl at ricarda.diehl@uni-mannheim.de for further assistance and information.

Cost of living

Approx. EUR 970 – EUR 1000* per month (including rent)

Fees

By law, every student must pay a semester fee to obtain the enrollment status. The fee currently amounts to EUR 100* per semester. Kindly note that all exchange students need to pay this fee in order to be enrolled.





Services

Exchange students can access the same facilities as regular degreeseeking students, such as libraries, computer centers, sports facilities and cafeterias.

Buddy Program

Exchange students can opt to be matched with a Mannheim student (organized by our student initiative ESN VISUM).

Courses

Information on courses

The university's course catalog for exchange students can be found in the <u>online course catalog</u>. Business exchange students may also take courses offered by other schools (restrictions might apply) but are required to take the majority of their courses at the Business School.

Course selection

Master/graduate students may take courses from our M.Sc. program (Mannheim Master in Management). Master-level courses are assigned to one of six areas on the right-hand side.



Course load

There is no minimum/maximum required amount of credits on our end, but we recommend not taking on a course load of more than 30 ECTS (credit points) per semester (which we consider a full semester workload).

Course registration

Course registration varies, however, by when and how students need to register will be stated clearly in the course description in the online course catalog.

Language

At the Business School, most of our courses are taught in English. Some courses are taught in German.

German language courses

Four-week intensive German language courses are offered in January and in August (special rates for exchange students). The German language courses offered during the semester are free apart from a registration fee of 15 EUR per course. Each exchange student can take up to three courses per semester. There is an online registration before/at the beginning of lectures.
