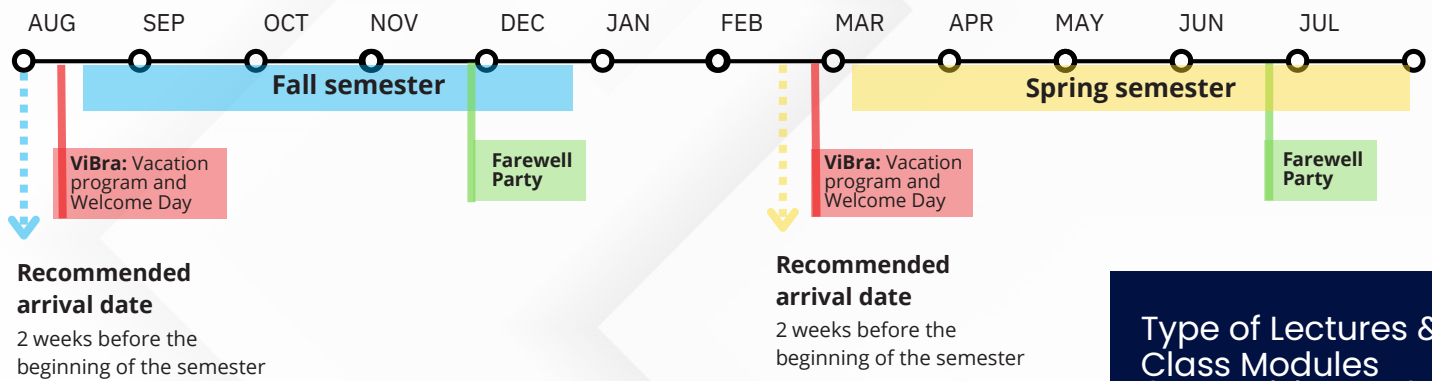

Step-by-step

Access the SRI/UFF website: app.uff.br/sri and complete the online application form.

Step 2

Attach the required documents (listed below) and submit the application within the specified deadline.

Wait for confirmation by e-mail from SRI/UFF.

Essential Information:

EVERY STUDENT AT UFF MUST HAVE A...

- **CPF** (Cadastro de Pessoa Física):
 - Must be **requested** already during the **visa process** in the **country of origin**, in a Brazilian diplomatic authority
 - **Without a CPF it is not possible** to access basic services, including the UFF university restaurant.
- **CRNM** (National Migration Registration Card):
 - **Mandatory document** for all foreigners in Brazil.
 - Deadline: **up to 90 days after arrival** in the country.

Undergraduate Mobility

International mobility students should have **concluded** at least **1 full year** of studies in their **home institution**.

At UFF, students may enroll in **3 to 7 courses per semester**, according to their choice.

It's necessary to **attend** at least **75% of the classes**.

Applicant students will only have a **provisional study plan**, which will be confirmed after their arrival at UFF.

All **questions should be sent** to our contact **email** address, avoiding direct contact with departments and professors before arriving at the university

Buddy Program – PAI (International Student Mentorship Program): UFF students help international students adapt, facilitating their integration.

Minor:
The Minor in Global Challenges is a full minor course focused on teaching the SDGs with an emphasis on inequalities to local and international students. (All course are taught either in English, French or Spanish)



ViBra (Vitrine Brasil) is the on-site vacation program for international mobility students. This program offers classes and activities on Brazilian history, culture, economy and language. In addition to visits to historical sites in the region, a welcoming ceremony with a capoeira class. This program issues a certificate of credits/hours.

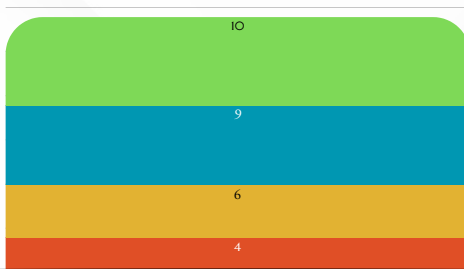
falaMUNDO:

Portuguese for Foreigners Courses

Crash Course: 2 weeks of classes, for undergraduate students who wish to learn the language before coming to UFF. The course is geared towards foreign undergraduate students who declare a basic knowledge of Portuguese and take place concurrently with the vacation program (ViBra)

Regular Course: classes offered on-site throughout UFF's academic semester for international mobility students. This course offers a placement test at the beginning of the classes, to better allocate students among Basic, Intermediate and Advanced level classes

Other compulsory fees for international students

Students will need to pay two fees: one to obtain their **student visa** and another to obtain a **mandatory document named RNM**, from Brazil's Federal Police, as per federal regulations.

Housing information

UFF does not offer student housing. However, the ICO shares a list of accommodation recommendations based on the past experiences of other international mobility students.



Insurances



Students will **need to obtain a health insurance** of their choice to study at UFF. Health insurance must be valid within the national territory of Brasil, **for their full period of stay.** The insurance must include **coverage for COVID-19.**

Study permits/ visa process



A student visa is required for on-site mobility. The visa must be obtained **BEFORE** the student's arrival in Brazil. The time for concluding the visa request process varies, so it's recommended to start it as soon as the student receives their acceptance letter.

It's mandatory for every student to seek the closest Brazilian embassy or consulate to inquire about the correct visa to study in Brazil. The student visa is mandatory for every student who will develop academic activities in the country for a period longer than 90 days.

You must obtain the visa from the Brazilian consulate in your area of jurisdiction and, in some cases, a personal visit to the consulate may be required. You should apply for a visa from the consulate whose area of jurisdiction includes your permanent home.



Transportation

Arrival by plane

The nearest airport is Rio de Janeiro International Airport – Galeão – Antonio Carlos Jobim (GIG), located about 13.7 miles from UFF.

Bus

At the Terminal 1 (GIG), you can board either of two buses that go to Niterói, numbered 760D and 1900D. With the Moovit app you can see when the bus will arrive and ask the app to notify where you should drop off.



Cost of living

Estimated: **R\$ 1.700,00 per month** (housing, transportation, food, and leisure)

UFF offers lunch and dinner, from Monday to Friday at the University Restaurant for only R\$ 0,70 per meal.
