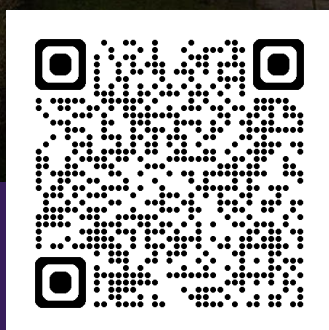

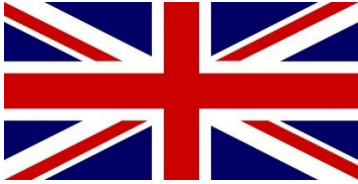

Language requirements



Language requirements are mainly linked to visa sponsorship.

Students that don't need a **Student Visa**, do not need to provide evidence of English.

Students joining
for one semester only

Evidence of English is not required.

However, students must be proficient in English to B2 level in the CEFR. A confirmation from the partner would be sufficient.

Full year students

Students must check if they need a **Student Visa**. If they do, they will need to submit evidence of English as part of their application to study with us. Students coming **for a full year** who require a Student Visa must have an IELTS (or equivalent) score of at least 6.5 overall, with no less than 6 in each component.

Minimum grade requirements



We trust that the partners will select their best students to join our exchange programme and therefore we don't set minimum grades for application.

We don't normally reject any applications, but we reserve the right to deny access to certain modules if we believe that the students don't have the necessary background to be successful on their requested modules.

All Learning agreements will be reviewed by our Academic Exchange Coordinator.

Visa information

Check if you need a visa:

New rules to enter the UK for “non-visa nationals”

Electronic Travel Authorisation (ETA)

The UK government is rolling out the Electronic Travel Authorisation (ETA) process for visitors. This allows single semester students to visit the UK for up to 6 months and costs £10. More details can be found at <https://www.gov.uk/guidance/apply-for-an-electronic-travel-authorisation-eta>.

Students who are required to apply for a Visitor visa before travelling to the UK (i.e. ‘visa nationals’ e.g. China, India, Turkey) are not affected by this change.

Module choices

A list of available modules is released at the end of May every year. Modules don't usually change much so please refer to the list of modules from the previous year, if you are selecting modules before the release date.

Please note that for 2025-26 there will be updates to the PG modules available. We will release the new module list as soon as possible.

Modules should be selected from the same level: students should not combine modules from undergraduate and postgraduate programmes.

We expect exchange students to register for the same number of credits as a student registered for a Loughborough degree.

In exceptional circumstances we may allow the registration in a different number of credits (up to a maximum of 35 ECTS). Partners should submit their requests directly to LB-international@lboro.ac.uk stating the reasons why the student should be taking more modules than the full workload of a Loughborough student. All requests will be looked at on a case-by-case basis.

After the programme starts module changes are only possible if the student has **timetable conflicts**, therefore, we advise all the students to carefully consider and discuss their modules with their home universities.

Grading System at Loughborough

Loughborough does not work with ECTS system. All our modules are valued as Loughborough credits. A full workload is 120 Loughborough credits for the full year, or 60 Loughborough credits for one semester.

1 ECTS is equivalent to 2 Loughborough credits.

30 ECTS is equivalent to 60 Loughborough credits. - (one semester workload)

60 ECTS is equivalent to 120 Loughborough credits. - (full year workload)

Grades at Loughborough are shown as a percentage from 0% (minimum grade) to 100% (maximum grade).

The pass mark for undergraduate students is 40%.

The pass mark for postgraduate students is 50%.

Accommodation

When the Placements, Exchanges and Governance Team registers you in the University database, you will receive an official acceptance letter. This letter will state your application number and your student number. You will need these details to apply for a room on campus.

Please be patient...

Our central team processes a high volume of applications - in addition to other requirements of their role. Official acceptance letters are usually sent by mid-July for semester 1 and full year exchange students and mid-December for semester 2 exchange students.

There is a wide range of accommodation options for students in Loughborough and a dedicated team at the University called the **Student Accommodation Centre (SAC)** who will help you to find a place to live. You can apply for a room on campus or off campus, catered or self-catered, with private or shared facilities.

On-campus accommodation:

There are rooms in catered and self-catered university halls of residence, single or shared. The cost of accommodation varies greatly depending on the kind of room. Catered on-

campus rooms can cost from around £155 to £220 per week. Self-catered rooms are from around £112 to £185 per week.

Off-campus accommodation:

The Accommodation Office also helps with approved off-campus accommodation. Rooms off-campus can cost around £90 per week, dependent on whether bills are included.

SAC cannot guarantee all students a place in halls of residence, however, they will help you to find accommodation with an off campus approved provider, should you need it.

You will receive the outcome of your application for accommodation:

- At the beginning of September (for semester 1 and Full year students)
- In December and January (for semester 2 students)

If you would like to have your accommodation sorted before this, you may wish to consider finding private accommodation yourself.

You have several options in and around Loughborough town however do not sign any contract without running it through our Student Advice and Support Services. They can check your contract prior to signing, to identify potential issues:

Your health matters

Students that don't need a Student Visa are not entitled to regular health care.

Students that come to the UK to study for less than 6 months don't need to apply for a Student Visa, and therefore they will be treated as "visitors". Visitors are not entitled to free healthcare nor a family doctor, but they can visit the hospital in an emergency.

Hospital visits will be charged therefore we recommend that you buy travel insurance that comes with healthcare cover, so you can recover any costs that you incur.

If you are an EU, EEA or Swiss national you will be exempt from some medical costs if you have a European Health Insurance Card (EHIC). It is important that you apply for an EHIC in your own country and bring it with you.

Students entering the UK on a Student Visa are entitled to health care the same way as a resident:

Students that come to the UK to study for more than 6 months are entitled to free healthcare and **they can** register for a GP (family doctor) including the medical centre on campus. When you apply for a visa, you will be asked to pay the Immigration Health Surcharge (IHS). This costs £470 and will allow you to use most of the NHS services for free. However, services as prescriptions, dental treatment and optical treatment are not included and need to be paid.

Support for students with disabilities

Loughborough University can offer support across a wide range of disabilities including dyslexia, autistic spectrum conditions and long-term health conditions.

Depending on an assessment of your specific needs, your support could include:

- Examination and assessment adjustments
- Access to free specialist software on the University IT system
- Orientation and familiarisation visits around campus
- Provision of specialist mentoring and/or study support sessions
- Bespoke library access
- Signposting to self-help material and local services related to mental health and wellbeing
- Adaptions to the physical environment or provision of equipment in your Halls of Residence

Students with physical, mental or long-term health conditions are encouraged to disclose them on the Incoming Student Application Form so that any requisite assistance and support can be put in place.

Living Costs

By UK standards Loughborough is not an expensive place to live. Your living costs will vary depending upon your lifestyle and choice of accommodation, but we have estimated that you will need around £9,207 a year to cover accommodation and all major living expenses, including food, clothing, books and local travel.

The University offers a free airport pick-up service from Heathrow Airport Terminal 2 for students arriving for semester 1 (late September). Please note that this service is not available to Semester 2 exchange students.
