General Information

- Exchange students have the flexibility to enroll in courses across our different **faculties/schools**.
- It's important to note that students **cannot** simultaneously enroll in undergraduate and graduate courses.
- Additionally, students are required to enroll in a minimum of **three courses** and can take a maximum of **six** per semester.
- Furthermore, all **exchange students** are **mandated to purchase** the **official medical insurance provided** by EAFIT.



Language Requirements

For courses taught in **Spanish**, a **B1** level is required. For courses taught in **English** no certificate is required.

Required Documents

Our Spanish Program

Universidad EAFIT offers a well-rounded program to help students improve their communication skills. Our Language Center also teaches English, French, Portuguese, German, Italian, and our main language, Spanish (for non-native speakers).

Please note that language courses, including Spanish, have a fee for both national and international students and are not part of the standard program curriculum. While these courses don't offer academic credits directly, students may request credit recognition from their home universities after completing the Spanish course. [See more info](#)



Buddy Program

Our **Buddy Program** is designed to support students participating in both national and international academic exchange programs as they transition into our university life and our culture.

Through our buddies, international students can access information about facilities, services, academic procedures, and the overall EAFIT system.

International students will benefit from guidance tailored to navigating life at Universidad EAFIT and in Medellín, including invitations to engage in social activities alongside local students, personalized support for cultural integration, and avenues for language exchange opportunities.



Services

We offer extended and comprehensive health care services for our entire community, including international students:

- First aid and emergency medical care
- Health workshops.

Exchange students have free access to general medical consultations. Some of the mentioned services may have additional costs.

Housing

Each student is responsible for finding and securing accommodation. However, EAFIT has partnered with **VICO**, a platform that offers apartments close to the campus. **VICO** ensures that each apartment is thoroughly inspected and meets quality standards before being listed, providing our students with added confidence.

Living cost

Single room or shared apartments:

300 USD - 450 USD per month. The cost will depend on the facilities of the place and the proximity to the campus.

Food on campus:

- Daily menu: 6.5 USD - 7 USD.
- Other meals: 7 USD - 9.5 USD.

Transport:

- Bus/metro: 1 USD.
- Taxi/Uber: 5 USD - 6 USD (depending on the routes).

Migratory Requirements

For an exchange semester, students from the Schengen Area are **not required to apply for a visa to enter Colombia**. Instead, they can enter the country for a 180-day period of stay using a special permit called **PID**. This permit is granted upon arrival in Colombia, and students must present the PID letter provided by us.

Additionally, EAFIT will provide students with a letter to facilitate the process of obtaining the PID permit.
