



The ISEG Confidence Index for the month of October is now available

The ISEG confidence index for October, 2021, for the short-term evolution of the Portuguese economy was 38.1%, which represents an increase in confidence in relation to the previous month, whose index value was 37.5. In quarter-on-quarter terms, the variation of the index was 39% in October, maintaining the base effect of the sharp fall in the index in 2020. The current level of the index exceeds pre-pandemic levels. The consensus of the members of the Panel regarding the evolution of the economy remains unchanged.



The Confidence Index, which is calculated by ISEG's Economic Analysis Group, has already been cited in Jornal Económico.
