The Master's in Development and International Cooperation (MDCI), which was launched in 1993-1994, is the oldest in Portugal in this area. It is a multidisciplinary Master's that links theory with research and practice. Over the last few decades this degree has been studied by generations of managers, professionals, and researchers from Portugal, Brazil, and the Lusophone countries. The PhD in Development Studies of Universidade de Lisboa also has its genesis in the MDCI, which was taught for the first time at ISEG in 2010.

In 2021, in conjunction with CEsA - Centre for Research in Africa and Development Studies, the MDCI is going to launch a new initiative: Oficina Global (Global Workshop). The aim of Oficina Global is to strengthen the role of the University as a meeting point for all those who want to positively change the world. We don't know what path this will take, but we know what we want: a freer, more equal and fairer world. This is what drives Oficina Global. For we are living through periods of profound global transformation which are marked by uncertainty and complexity in all the areas of political, economic, and social activity where we want to contribute as a space for research and civic action. Our desire is to invest more time in reflecting on how to find solutions to the problems that affect us as a society, and also find and create innovative solutions, as is common to all workshops ..



In 2018, Joana Bacelar's Final Master's Work (MDCI 2016-2018) was one of the pilot projects that influenced the decision to create Oficina Global. Joana designed an awareness campaign about the commitment to implement the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) among the thousands of members of CNE - the Portuguese Scout Organisation. On the 6th of December 2021 Joana was distinguished with the 'Messenger of Peace Hero Award' by the World Organization of the Scout Movement (WMO) for her work in furthering the SDGs, together with 24 other colleagues.

The Messengers of Peace movement unites young Scouts in a global network and inspires them to lead and take action in their communities and contribute to peace and sustainable development. Since 2010, Messengers of Peace has involved almost all 172 national Scout Organisations and has inspired Scouts to lead over 16 million community development projects.

Joana is now the coordinator of CNE's department for SDGs. With a team of seven young volunteers, Joana has carried out more than 100 clarification sessions about the SDGs for more than 20,000 participants and has written more than 20 articles on SDGs which have been published in the Flor de Lis magazine, which is regularly read by 14,000 Scout leaders.

#### CÉU MATEUS'S ISEG, in first-person

"" walked into ISEG for the first time in 1988 and I studied here for the customary five years of undergraduate degrees of that time. During most of the degree I thought that Economics was not for me and I even thought of dropping out. However, towards the end of the degree I came across public economics, and from then on I realised that there was indeed a part of Economics that I was excited about. At the time, I was of the opinion that health economics was still something very vague, however it came to pass that both my Master's thesis and my job in an institute belonging to the Ministry of Health (now extinct) were in the area of health. When I went to the academy I was already a 'health economist', and nowadays I can't see myself doing anything else.

My involvement with the Students Association was my first experience in organising events, ranging from electoral campaigns, to concerts and debate cycles. From then on I don't think I ever stopped being active in 'civil society', mainly through being a member of scientific societies and being highly committed to the Portuguese Association of Health Economics (APES).

As an academic, researcher, and the Chair of APES, Apart from being a mentor to early career researchers, I manage to reconcile my love for health economics with the sharing of scientific work that addresses issues that are dear to me, such as, for example, socio-economic inequalities in health or gender issues regarding the access to health treatment. It was at ISEG, through many of my professors - such as Francisco Pereira de Moura and António Garcia Pereira - that I learnt to be a social scientist. Economics is a science of people for people, and human behaviour is always fascinating!

Equally as important as all that I have mentioned above, ISEG provided me with friends for life. We all crossed paths here, and although not all of us are practicing economists anymore, we still share the same commitment to change the world.

Returning to ISEG in 2021 makes me realise that the person I am today started here when I first entered Quelhas in 1988."
