ISEG INDEX | December, 2022



The ISEG Index for December 2022 regarding the short-term evolution of Portuguese economic activity, registered a value of 35.7, which basically represents a stablisation in the level of confidence in comparison to the previous month, when the value was 35.8. In year-on-year terms, the percentage variation of the index was -7.8%.
