ISEG is to host, for the first time in Portugal, the Semifinals of the prestigious international Hult Prize competition, with a prize of 1 million dollars.

On the 23rd and 24th June, ISEG will host the Semifinals of the prestigious international Hult Prize competition (officially called Hult Prize Global Summit), an annual competition that challenges thousands of student entrepreneurs from all over the world to create and launch businesses with the aim of addressing some of society's most pressing issues through social entrepreneurship. At the end of the competition, the winning university team will take home \$1 million to fund their idea and make the global fashion industry more sustainable, with each of the five runners-ups receiving \$100,000 in funding.

ISEG will thus welcome 47 startups and 176 university students from 28 countries from all continents, representing 43 different universities, which will compete for one of the six places in the Hult Prize Annual Finals, which is to be held in Paris, France, this September.

The Hult Prize is an international foundation that inspires and promotes different programmes that challenge student entrepreneurs to solve the world's biggest challenges through social entrepreneurship and positive global impact. Since its inception, the competition has impacted over one million university students from over 100 countries around the world. Over 100,000 university students are involved this year, creating high-impact startups that address the challenge for the year (which this year is sustainable fashion) that is aligned with the UN Sustainable Development Goals.



As for the annual competition, this starts at the local level, in the more than one thousand Universities that annually host the Hult Prize's OnCampus Programme, which is a local competition held at each University, which is organised by student volunteers. The students are led by a Campus Director, who is the student who coordinates their organising committee and ensures the implementation of the Programme, which is previously prepared by the Hult Prize. Applications for this position are open here.

A winner is elected from each OnCampus Programme who will advance in the competition, in the same way as the teams selected through the Open App. The best startups were chosen to compete at an international level in one of 12 semifinals (Global Summits) held in the United States, Mexico, Brazil, Italy, Kenya, Tunisia, UAE, India, Taiwan, Australia, and now Portugal for the first time.

After these events, the 20 selected teams will participate in the next phase of the programme -the Hult Prize Accelerator Programme – where they will be accompanied by several experts and transform their ideas into investment-ready business social enterprises. In turn, 6 of these teams will be selected and will compete in the final in Paris!

Lisbon Summit 2023 | ISEG hosts the semi-final of the Hult Prize Global Summit competition




For the first time ISEG is to hosts the Hult Prize Lisbon Summit 2023 on the 23rd and **24th June.** This is a global competition of social entrepreneurship that endeavors to support the projects of young university entrepreneurs, whose innovative solutions can have a significant and positive impact on society.

Practical Mindfulness and Chi-Kung Workshop









AUGUORDY (SUCIUS), University of Lisbon ABSTRACT The research (support of the Center of Studies on Africa and Development of the University of Lisbon) is defined as exploratory and aims to evaluate whether the methodology of inquiry and analysis of the identity of J. Cheek, S. Briggs, S. Smith and L. Tropp [B], can be adapted to a fragile state like Guinea-Bissau. This methodology consists in the assessment of the importance attributed by the respondents of 70 sentences from which the characteristics of individual and social identity (family and collective) are extracted (Cheek, J.M. & Briggs, S.R. [7]). The phrases were sent by digital means to 102 Guineans known in person or only by Facebook with a request for response and dissemination and obtained 183 responses. These answers, calculated according to the methodology adopted, allowed to define some identity characteristics of the respondents. We tried to interpret these results using other surveys conducted since 2014 in Guinea-Bissau with different themes. It is concluded by realizing that this is a method that can contribute to the knowledge of the national identity of Guineans, but insufficient. This conclusion remains to be demonstrated if it is carried out with a statistically significant sample.

National identity is a very difficult concept to define with sufficient precision to be measured, although it is increasingly used either by scientists and academics, by varied social groups, or even, by the media. Because it consists of multiple variables, it is evolutionary (that is, it changes with time and circumstances) and it wants to be the synthesis of personal identities
