ISEG and the Faculty of Economics of Universidade José Eduardo dos Santos in Huambo, Angola, celebrate 12 years of partnership



ISEG centered into a partnership with the Faculty of Economics of Universidade José Eduardo dos Santos (UJES) 12 years ago, which gave rise to the first Master's degrees in Huambo, Angola. These degrees in Business Sciences and Accounting, Taxation, and Business Finance, marked a historic moment for higher education in Huambo, involving more than 70 students.

The degrees not only reinforce academic development in Angola, but they also contribute to the education of highly qualified professionals, with clear repercussions for the labour market, as evidenced by the admission of several students to the General Tax Administration (AGT).

ISEG's scientific co-operation was crucial to this transformation, with the involvement of Professors Pedro Verga Matos, Paulo Lopes Henriques, and Manuel Ennes Ferreira.

More than a decade after the first public defences, the impact of this project continues to highlight the success of this academic partnership, promoting regional development and creating opportunities for sustainable growth.
